## QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR THREE MONTHS ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2007

### Highlights

- ❖ **IPO capital raising completed over-subscribed raising \$3 million before costs**
- ❖ **Admitted to the official list of the ASX on 19 December 2007 with code BTU**

### Overview

The board of Bathurst Resources Ltd ("Bathurst") is pleased to present its quarterly activities report for the quarter ended 31 December 2007.

This was a quarter of great progress for the company with the Company completing an IPO capital raising of \$3 million and listing on the Australian Stock Exchange.

Bathurst has signed an agreement giving it the right to earn up to 75% of the Mount Clifford project which is prospective for nickel, base metals and gold mineralisation. Under the agreement, Bathurst acquired 20% of the Mount Clifford project and has the right to earn up to a further 55% in the project by spending \$1,050,000 over 54 months. Bathurst exercised this option on 11 December 2007.



## Exploration Strategy

Bathurst is focusing on the Mt Clifford project, 50km northwest of Leonora in Western Australia. The Mt Clifford Project is prospective for gold, nickel and base metal mineralisation and covers approximately 30 square kilometres. The Project is comprised of two tenements with Bathurst having a 20% stake in the tenements and the right to earn up to a 75% interest.

Bathurst's Exploration Strategy is designed to test the current targets and any other targets generated for nickel, base metals and gold mineralization. The exploration programmes will consist primarily of geological mapping and rock chip sampling, complemented by the interpretation of satellite imagery and aerial and ground geophysical (magnetic, radiometric and electromagnetic) surveys to define targets to be drill tested.

## New Projects

Bathurst is currently assessing new opportunities in the resource sector both within and outside of its current project areas.

## Corporate

Bathurst Resources was admitted to the official list of the ASX on 19 December 2007 after raising \$3 million through the issue of 15 million shares at 20c each.



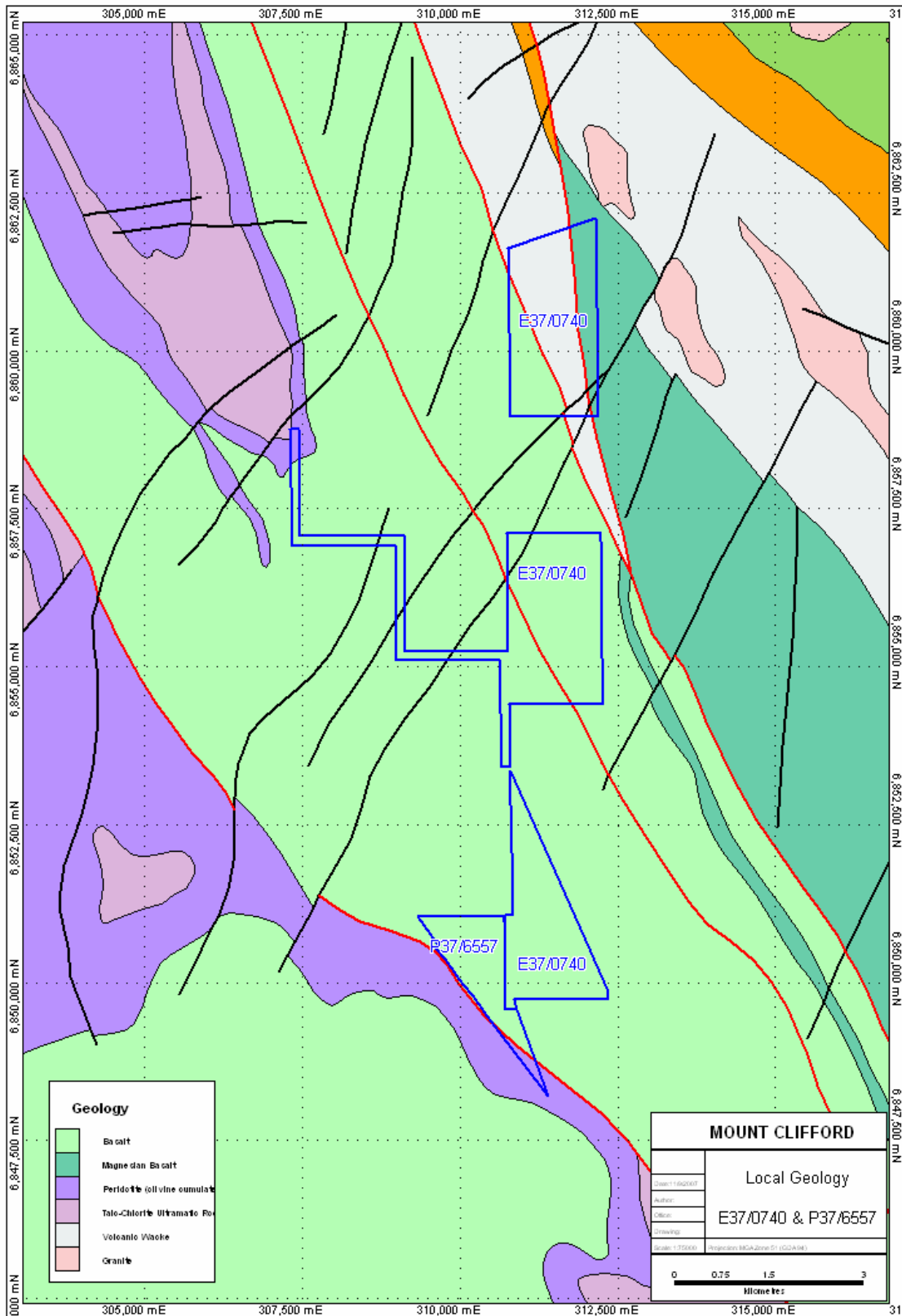
